GPPSD and the Curriculum Renewal

GPPSD started the process last spring by ensuring our system was ready to implement the new curriculum. In working with school leaders and teachers across all grades, Kindergarten to grade 6, we prepared through collaboration and planning to roll out the new curriculum/curricula.

Starting the 2022 school year we continued with:

- Collaborating with our regional learning consortium to support teacher professional learning.
- Centralized resources were purchased to support teacher and student learning in math and English language arts & literature (ELAL)
- Division Professional Learning Fridays are focused on curriculum implementation

What this means for your child

What your child is learning in the three subjects will be slightly different. Your child's report card will also look different in these three subject areas, with a focus on Outcomes, Progression and Competencies.

- Literacy and Numeracy is embedded in learning across all subject areas. It is foundational, allowing students to live, learn, and work as knowledgeable, active participants in a democratic society.
- Knowledge and behaviours that students may demonstrate by the end of each grade level will be found in the <u>Literacy</u> and <u>Numeracy</u> <u>Outcomes and Progressions</u>
- Combinations of knowledge, skills, and characteristics that students develop and apply for successful learning, living, and working are now called <u>Competencies</u>. Competencies work together with learning outcomes to prepare Alberta students for successful and fulfilling lives and to make meaningful contributions to their communities and the world.
