Fairness and Safety in Sport: What families need to know

At Grande Prairie Public Schools we want all students to feel welcome, safe, and supported in their extracurricular activities. To ensure fairness and safety, we follow Alberta's **Bill 29: Fairness and Safety in Sport Act** when organizing sports teams.

What the policy means:

- All students are welcome to participate in school sports that match their interests and skills.
- If a sport is offered **specifically for female athletes** in grades 7-12, students must confirm they were **assigned female at birth** to be eligible to participate on that team.
- Parents (or the athlete if 18+) must sign a simple declaration form confirming eligibility.
- If someone has concerns about an athlete's eligibility for a female-only team, a **confidential review process** is available. The athlete can keep playing while the review is underway.
- Any decisions made will be handled respectfully and privately by school staff.

This policy helps our schools follow government law while protecting the dignity and privacy of all students.

Parent FAQ - Fairness in School Sports

What is this policy?

Alberta's **Bill 29** requires school divisions to have clear rules about who can participate in gender-specific sports leagues. This policy ensures our division is following the law and providing fair opportunities for students.

What does "female-only league" mean?

This refers to teams or competitions designated for girls or young women, such as a junior girls' basketball team. To play on one of these teams, students must have been identified as female at birth.

Will my child need to share personal information?

Only for female-only teams. A parent (or student over 18) will sign a short form declaring the student was born female. No medical records are required unless a concern is raised and reviewed confidentially by the principal.

What happens if someone questions a player's eligibility?

- A parent, athlete, or coach can bring a confidential concern to the school principal.
- The student can continue playing while it's reviewed.
- The principal may ask for a copy of the student's birth registration.
- All decisions will be communicated respectfully and privately.

Can students still play if they aren't eligible for a female-only team?

Yes. Students can participate on other teams (e.g., co-ed or open teams) if available. Principals will work with families to find a suitable option.

Who do I talk to if I have questions?
